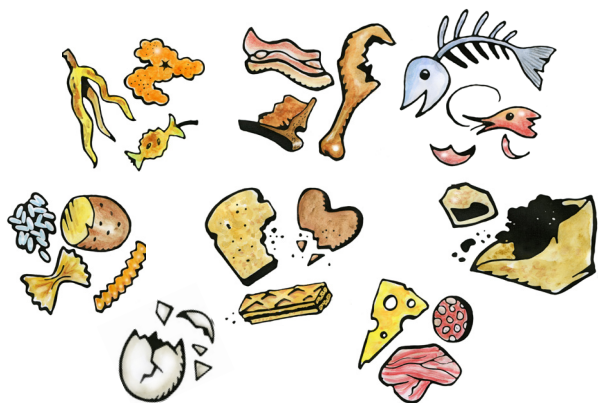


Yes please!

The following items can go in the brown bag:

- Peel and shells from fruit, vegetables, eggs and shellfish
- Small bones and leftovers from meat, fish and poultry
- Pasta, rice and potatoes
- Grains and flour
- Bread, biscuits, cakes and sweets
- Coffee grounds, coffee filters and tea
- Cheese and spreads



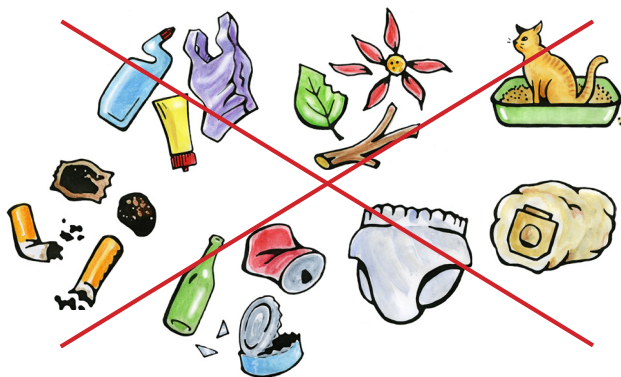
No thanks!

The following items must *not* be put in the brown bag:

- Tobacco, cigarette stubs, snus and chewing gum
- Nappies, wet wipes and other sanitary articles such as sanitary pads
- Flowers, plants and garden waste
- Vacuum cleaner dust bags
- Cat litter and pet droppings

Make sure you:

Sort glass, metal, plastic and other packaging items at the nearest recycling station.

Sorting guide for food waste

Sort your food waste and contribute to a better environment!

By producing biogas from food waste, we are reducing environmental impact and contributing to a better environment. The biogas replaces fossil fuels and is used to fuel bin lorries, buses and other vehicles. When biogas is produced, the remaining residue, the bio-fertiliser, is a perfect substitute for artificial fertiliser on our fields. This enables us to complete the cycle!

Food waste is everything that is left over and cannot be saved when you have prepared or eaten food. Apple cores, bread crusts, eggshells, fruit and vegetable leftovers, fish offal and bones from meat are all sorted as food waste. You sort the food waste in a brown paper bag that is placed in a brown bin intended for food waste.

How to use the food waste bag

- ✓ Unfold the brown paper bag and place it in the holder. It is important to use the holder, since it allows air to circulate around the bag so that it stays dry.
- ✓ Fold the top of the bag all the way round; this makes it easier to reclose the bag securely.
- ✓ Reseal the bag securely by rolling down the top.
- ✓ Change bags frequently, ideally every second or third day.
- ✓ Place the bag in your brown rubbish bin, which is intended for food waste.

Make sure you:

- ✓ Allow soggy food leftovers to drain before throwing them away
- ✓ Ideally, dry-peel fruit and vegetables directly into the bag
- ✓ Stand the bag in the holder
- ✓ Do not fill the bag above the dotted line
- ✓ Do not compress the food waste in the bag



Why shouldn't I use a plastic bag for food waste?

Never wrap plastic bags round the paper bag provided by VIVAB. If plastic contaminates the biogas process, large quantities of food waste have to be discarded. Brown rubbish bins containing plastic are not emptied, but instead generate an error message.

Paper bags are ideal for the biogas process. Using these enables all food waste to be utilised for biogas and bio-fertiliser.

How do I get more bags?

Do you live in detached house?

You can order more bags at www.vivab.info/minasidor. You will need to have your customer number and personal identity number to hand. You can also clamp a bag onto the lid of your brown bin before emptying. You will then get more bags when it is next emptied.

Do you live in an apartment?

Contact your housing cooperative or landlord, who will supply bags.

You can also collect bags and holders at one of our recycling centres or our offices at Åkarevägen 10 in Falkenberg and Hårdgatan 30A in Varberg.
